STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The Healthcare Specialist Education Trust (HSPET) is a registered charity (Number 292218) and is governed by a trust deed. The trust was established under a trust deed dated 25th June 1985 which was amended by deeds of variation dated 19th May 1994, 26th July 2006 and 29th January 2014.

Organisation

The charity is governed by its trust deed which specifies that there must be a minimum of fifteen and a maximum of twenty four trustees.

Trustees must be appointed for a term of three years or less by resolution of the Trustees passed at a Special Meeting and may stand for re-appointment for a further period of three years. In exceptional circumstances a trustee may be allowed to exceed the six year maximum where this is deemed to be in the best interest of the Trust.

The Board is required to meet at least two times a year and in practice meets four times a year.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal activity

The charity's principal activity is to advance education with particular reference to the study of developmental and therapeutic play, including psycho-social care, in hospital of children and their families. Registration of those who have successfully completed an approved course, and those on the register who meet the continuous professional develop standards for re-registration.

Investment Powers and Restrictions

Investments are held for the long term generation of income. The charity will not knowingly invest in securities that do not accord with its principles.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

HPSET key developments of 2019 have included the approval of the Higher Apprenticeship Award for the profession. A successful process completed in 9 months. Apprentices will be awarded the Foundation Degree in Healthcare Play Specialism and the Higher Apprenticeship Award.

The Foundation Degree Course is being delivered at Leeds City College, maintaining delivery of a course in the North of England.

Investment in the website has continued to faciliatate the online re-registration procee. 2019 saw the implemenation of the annual online registration process and listing on the Public Register.

Comprehensive work has taken place to develop the online three yearly audit of practice for registered practioners. All registrants will submit a profile once evry three years. Revised Code of Professional Conducts and Standards, format for audit profiles and criteria registrants need to meet to maintain registration have been published. The new process was published in September for submission to selected profiles in 2020.

A Fitness to Practice standard and process has been developed and published. One concern has been raised and been taken through the process during 2019.

HPSET working with the National Association of Health Play Staff (NAHPS) have been working in partnership to develop an action plan and the commitments of both Charities to investigate the opportunity for the profession to join the Professional Standards Authority.

HPSET & NAHPS have started to investigate the merger of both charities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting for Charities' issued in March 2015 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

Results for the year

Financially there was a deficit of £22,457 (2018: £6,254) in the net movement of funds for the year.

The main sources of income continued to be in indexation and re-registration fees.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to retain unrestricted reserves equivalent to at least twelve months of forecasted expenditure. As at 30th September 2019 unrestricted reserves amounted to approximately 25 months of expenditure (2018: 41 months), based upon expenditure incurred during the year.

PLANS FOR FUTURE

The Higher Apprenticeship in England will be delivered in all the English Colleges.

Applications to the Welsh & Scottish Assembly have been made for the development of Higher Apprenticeships and work will continue so the course can be delivered across the UK. We will investigate the opportunities to develop a course in Northern Ireland.

The new audit profile will be live in January 2020. A third of registrants will submit an online profile, the markers have received training to support the standards and fairness in marking and listing on the Public Register.

HPSET & NAHPS will continue to work in Partnership to resarch and write the application for Professional Standards Authority membership. It is estimated that this work will take three years to complete.

HPSET & NAHPS plan to merge the Charities with the support of the profession, our Boards and the Charity Commission in 2020.

All the work we undertake in 2020 will focus on the merger of the charities and to support the application to the Professional Standrds Authority.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- * Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- * Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- * Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
